Background & Purpose

South African has a growing appetite for Aquaculture, purely from a point of view of its potential in boosting economic development. This among other reasons, will be a solution to high unemployment and also provide sustainable alternative livelihoods to the Eastern Cape rural economic development. Fisheries production from wild capture fisheries has stagnated in recent years (FAO, 2016) while global population numbers, and overall consumption of fish, is increasing. Aquaculture will therefore play a significant role in providing much needed animal protein to feed future generations.

Aquaculture development forms part of the identified delivery units for Oceans Economy of the Eastern Cape. This project has a potential to create opportunities for rural economic development and economic development of the Mhlontlo Municipality - Eastern Cape Province also for the realization of the recently launched Ocean Economy programme for the province. Aquaculture has been identified as one of the key sectors with a huge potential to provide opportunities for job creation and bringing the much-needed economic development to poverty and unemployment-stricken areas of the country. The Aquaculture industry in South Africa is still relatively small in the global space but has shown growth potential and could contribute meaningfully to the country's gross domestic product (GDP).

Although a number of studies have been conducted on Aquaculture, most of these have focused on the scientific efficacy of the Tilapia species. Research and Economic feasibility studies are an important component of the development of the industry for the benefit of socioeconomic for rural

development of the underdeveloped areas. Feasibility studies when conducted properly can guide economic investment in order to ensure that:

- The most suitable species to culture and its benefits thereof;
- Practical financial models are developed
- Business plans are bankable and well developed
- Stakeholders are aware of the respective roles
- Proper implementation plans are in place
- Implementation and Technology transfer
- Monitoring and evaluation mechanisms are well suited to the identified goals

This will in turn help to avoid the problem of misguided investment that results in creation of unsustainable projects. Hence the need for comprehensive feasibility study and should in essence take the following into consideration:

- Prevailing macro and micro economic factors surrounding the envisaged work
- The presence of markets for the envisaged products
- The Technical viability of the undertaking
- Economic and financial merits of the project
 - Scenario planning and sensitivity analysis

The feasibility study will also assess the viability of a typical aquaculture venture as it depends on

- suitable environmental conditions to support production;
- availability of seed stock;
- access to feeds and production technology;
- access to equipment and supplies;
- access to markets:
- access to health management services, consultants and technical services

• a supportive regulatory environment that facilitates aquaculture development; and

• public acceptance of the environmental impacts associated with aquaculture development and

production.

In addition, the feasibility study should assess on a variety of aquaculture systems including:

- Aquaponics.

Recirculation Aquaculture Systems

Flow through land-based system

- Pond culture

Raceway

- 2.4"bid" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of services, works or goods, through price quotations, advertisedcompetitive bidding processes or proposals;
- 2.5 **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic

Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);

- 2.6 "comparative price" means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional
 - discounts that can be utilized have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7 "consortium or joint venture" means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8 "contract" means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state;

- 2.9 "EME" means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 million or less.
- 2.10 "Firm price" means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs or excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11 "functionality" means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes a juristic person;
- 2.14 **"rand value"** means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.15 "sub-contract" means the primary contractor's assigning, leasing, making out work to, or employing, another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.16"total revenue" bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007;

- 3.1 The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts;.
 - 3.3 Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
 - In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
 - 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must

be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.

3.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

- 5.2 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EMEs with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 5.3 Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 5.4 A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 5.5 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 5.6 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 5.7 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended sub-contractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
- 5.8 A person awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
