Introduction

Information and Communication Technology plays an important role in local government by improving responsiveness, increasing efficiency, transparency and enhancing service delivery to the communities. The use of ICT in local government includes the use of latest technologies in administration to simplify the operations in various systems used for day-to-day for service delivery purposes.

2. Scope of work

Phase 1

Mhlontlo Local Municipality is inviting all suitable qualified service providers to submit proposals for ICT server infrastructure and provision of an off-site disaster recovery solution.

- Upgrade of the server infrastructure to be able to host a number of municipal systems.
- Procurement of equipment, installation services and onsite deployment.
- Supply virtualization software, storage and other necessary software.
- Configuration of new equipment and make viable virtualized environment
- Upgrading of municipal physical servers to virtual servers
- Migrate all physical servers to virtual platform i.e File Server, Active Directory, Financial Management System (Linux).
- Migrate existing servers' data to the related virtual servers.
- Retire and decommission old equipment after migration to the virtual environment.

- Provide virtualization management console that can deliver the different features and functionalities. (Manageability, performance, availability, security and recoverability).
- Supply and installation of backup hardware and software for automated backup solution.
- Document all systems configuration and provide documentation to the municipality.
- The deployment of DRaaS.
- Four servers required to be on Disaster recovery (File Server, Active Directory, Financial Management System and Backup server)
- The provider will be responsible for replication schedule between production and DR site.
- The provider will be responsible to test and ensure data is recoverable.
- The service provider will perform two (4) DR tests per annum for critical systems (Financial Management System) and (2) DR test for other servers/systems /applications
- The provider must ensure data is encrypted between the different platforms when at rest, in motion or in use.
- The provisioning of DR services must cater for all municipal legacy systems as well as latest platforms, software versions, databases and system upgrades.
- The provider will be required to provide and document disaster recovery plan, technical systems configuration, and setup.
- The service provider will be required to handover the design documentation
- The service provider will be required to provide all software and licenses required for fully functioning of the services provided.
- The service provider will utilize the municipal bandwidth for connection between the municipal premises and DR site.
- The Municipal Recovery Time Objective (RTO) will be 2hours and Recovery Point Objective will be 24 hours
- The service provider will need to cater for 15 users to connect to DR site as and when there is a need.

- 2.12 "non-firm prices" means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13 "person" includes a juristic person;
- 2.14 **"rand value"** means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.15 "sub-contract" means the primary contractor's assigning, leasing, making out work to, or employing, another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;
- 2.16"total revenue" bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act and promulgated in the Government Gazette on 9 February 2007:
- 2.17 "trust" means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.18 "trustee" means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in
 - order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts;
 - 3.3 Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
 - 3.4 In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid

must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.

- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4.1 THE 80/20 OR 90/10 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 or 90 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

- 5.2 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EMEs with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 5.3 Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 5.4 A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 5.5 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 5.6 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 5.7 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended sub-contractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
- 5.8 A person awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
