Tender for the provisioning of a comprehensive medical care for all impounded animals to the Kumnkani Mhlontlo Local Municipality community services department for a period of thirty-six (36) months on an as and when required basis

1. INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE

The purpose of this quotation is to appoint a panel of three (3) service providers for the provisioning of a comprehensive medical care for all impounded animals, to the Community Services Department of Kumnkani Mhlontlo Local Municipality for a period of three (3) years on an as and when required basis. Bids will only be accepted from qualified and certified professional veterinarians within the related field

2. BACKGROUND

The Kumnkani Mhlontlo Local Municipality Community Services department have various impounded animals that consists of cattle, sheep, goats, horses (equine), mules .These animals

are required to be vaccinated and cared for should any medical conditions or injuries arise or occur.

The Kumkani Mhlontlo Local Municipality Community Services department therefore require a comprehensive veterinary service to ensure that the impounded animals in accordance with the Animals Protection Act 71 (Act 71 of 1962)

3. PROJECT SCOPE

To provide a comprehensive veterinary service to impounded animals of the Kumkani Mhlontlo Local Municipality Community Services department for a period of three years on an as and when required basis

The Comprehensive Veterinary Service must adhere to the following stipulation as described within the various Acts and Standards of animal as per the paragraph labeled Applicable National and International Standards

3.1. GENERAL

To provide a comprehensive veterinary service, to the impounded service animals of the Kumkani Mhlontlo Local Municipality Community Services department for a period of three years on an as and when required basis

The comprehensive veterinary service must include the following:

- Any veterinarian performing any of the required work on any of the animals must be in possession of BVSc degree with a minimum of at least two (2) years' experience after obtaining the required degree or a diploma in animal health with a minimum of at least two (2) years' experience
- All staff executing any veterinary work must be registered with the SAVC to perform any one of the following services:
- The veterinarian service as well as a qualified veterinarian must be available on a 24-hour standby basis as and when there is a need.
- The veterinarian must have the relevant experience in and be able to work on impounded livestock
- Preferably be in possession of a facility where sick animals can be housed and cared for at the facility from where he executes his duties when need arises;
- The facility must be registered or proof of application should be furnished
- If a locum is appointed by the successful service provider, a certified copy of such a locum's BVSc degree qualification/Diploma in Animal Health must be submitted to the municipality or his or her delegated representative.

SITE SPECIFICATIONS

Site inspections of all facilities will be executed during the technical evaluation phase during which the following must be provided by the successful tenderer:

- Proof of registration of facility .
- Proof of registration of all staff with the SAVC

All inspections will be carried out as per Rules 18 – 22: Minimum Standards for Veterinary Facilities.

The site from where the comprehensive veterinary service will be provided by:

A person who practices a veterinary profession, shall comply with the applicable minimum standards for a consulting room as well as animal hospital, are specified in these rules of the South African Veterinary Council (SAVC) and will then accordingly acknowledged and registered with this Council as a Surgical Veterinary Clinic.

Minimum Standards for Veterinary Facilities.

The following evidence must be provided upon request:

- Confirmation and proof of inoculations and vaccinations;
- Confirmation and proof of medical treatments executed;
- Confirmation and proof of medication administered.

3.2 PENALTIES

Bidders should note that although the need for a veterinary emergency service is not the norm, it remains imperative that the successful bidder have a qualified veterinarian who can act as an intermediary with full responsibility. In addition to this it is also imperative to note that only the appointed service provider can submit invoices to the municipality for service rendered during such a period.

Failure to not institute this arrangement will result in penalties being instituted against the bidder. Failure by the successful bidder to arrange a qualified veterinarian to act as an intermediary with full responsibility in his/her absence, and where the municipality can prove that this resulted in loss of life or limb of any of the impounded animals, the municipality will claim for all damages and losses incurred.

4.1 ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLIANCE

4.2 MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

Original certified copies by the National Authority (SAPS) of the following information/documents must be provided when proposals are submitted to ensure full compliance.

(A copy of a certified document will not be accepted).

- The BVSc degree of the veterinarian / Diploma in animal health
- SAVC certification of staff where applicable
- Proof that the veterinarian has the relevant two (2) or more years of experience in and be able to work on animals.
- Proof that the veterinarian have a facility where sick animals can be housed and cared for at the facility from where he execute his duties;
- Proof that the veterinarian have comprehensive hospital service to his/her accessibility;
- Proof that the veterinarian have access digital x-ray facility available;
- Proof that the veterinarian are able to provide a laboratory service when there is a need.
- This service due to nature of this contract the practice and surgery of the prospective bidder must be located within 50-kilometer radius area from the Kumkani Mhlontlo Local Municipality pounds; the service provider must provide proof of address in the form of municipal rates and taxes account or a sign valid Lease agreement in the name of the company / bidder.

Failure to attach the requested documentation will result in immediate disqualification:

- Bidders must complete the pricing schedule in full. Failure to comply with this stipulation will result in immediate disqualification.

The approach that will be adopted by the municipality when procuring from the panels will be as follows:

Requirement will be determined as per the animal pound needs and the number of animal impounded

Specifications and request for quotation documents will be prepared.

Quotations will then be invited, evaluated (Price and Specific goal), and awarded accordingly, however,

The municipality may, for each quotation invited from the panel, identify and define an objective criterion to be applied.

The objective criteria mentioned above will allow the municipality to only consider and award quotations to service providers who comply with these criteria.

The municipality reserves the right not to appoint the highest point scorer, but to pro-rata the awards, based on consideration of quantities.

The municipality will perform risk analysis during the evaluation process considering market related prices as well as the bidders past delivery records within KMLM.

Service Level Agreements/ Contracts will be signed after approval of award.

Purchase Orders will thereafter be issued.

In cases of emergency a process stipulated in the SCM policy will be utilised.

ADDENDUM TO THE CONTRACT: PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

1.1. Processing limitations

It is recorded that, pursuant to its obligations under this Agreement, Service Provider will process Personal Information in connection with and for the purposes of the provision of the Services for or on behalf of Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM and will act as Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM's Operator for purposes of Protection of Personal Information Act (POPIA) no.4 of 2013. Unless required by law, Service Provider shall process the Personal Information only:

- 1.1.1. On behalf of Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM and in compliance with its instructions and this Agreement;
- 1.1.2. For the purposes connected with the provision of the Service Provider services or as specifically otherwise instructed or authorised by Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM in writing; and
- 1.1.3. Service Provider shall treat the Personal Information that comes to its knowledge or into its possession as confidential and shall not disclose it without the prior written consent of Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM.

1.2. Security measures

- 1.2.1. Service Provider warrants that it shall secure the integrity of the Personal Information in its possession or under its control by taking appropriate, reasonable technical and organisational measures to prevent:
 - (a) Loss of, or damage to, or unauthorised destruction of the Personal Information; and

- (b) Unlawful access to or processing of the Personal Information.

1.2.2. Service Provider shall take reasonable measures to:

- (a) Identify all reasonable foreseeable internal and external risks to the Personal Information in its possession or under its control;
- (b) Establish and maintain appropriate safeguards against the risk identified;
- (c) Regularly verify that the safeguards are effectively implemented;
- (d) Ensure that the safeguards are continually updated in response to new risks or deficiencies in previously implemented safeguards; and
- (e) Shall notify Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM of the risks identified and the safeguards established and implemented from time to time.

1.2.3. Service Provider shall:

- (a) Have due regard to generally accepted information security practices and processes which may apply to it;
- (b) Comply with Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM's information security practices and procedures and applicable industry or professional rules and regulations, of which Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM undertakes to keep Service Provider informed from time to time; and
- (c) Within five (5) business days of a request from Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM, Service Provider shall provide to Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM a written explanation and full details of the appropriate technical and organisational measures taken by or on behalf of Service Provider to demonstrate and ensure compliance with this clause.

1.3. Service Provider's general obligations with regards to Personal Information

1.3.1. In addition to the other obligations set out in this clause, Service Provider shall:

- (a) Take reasonable steps to ensure the reliability of any of its employees who have access to the Personal Information;

- (b) Limit access to the Personal Information only to those employees who need to know to enable Service Provider to perform the services and ensure that employees used by Service Provider to provide the Services have undergone training in the care and handling of the Personal Information;
- (c) Deal promptly and properly with all reasonable inquiries from Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM relating to its Processing of the Personal Information and provide to Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM copies of the Personal Information in the format reasonably specified by Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM;
- (d) Promptly inform Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM of its inability to comply with Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM's instructions and this clause, in which case Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM is entitled to suspend the processing of Personal Information and/or terminate this Agreement;
- (e) Provide Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM with full co-operation and assistance in relation to any requests for access or correction or complaints made by Data Subjects; and
- (f) At the request of Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM or any regulatory body, submit its Personal Information Processing facilities for audit of the Processing activities covered by this Agreement.

1.4. Notifications

1.4.1. Service Provider must notify Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM in writing:

- (a) Within 1 (one) business day or otherwise as soon as reasonably possible if any Personal Information has been or may reasonably believe to have been accessed or acquired by an unauthorised person or if a breach has occurred with reference to its use of the Personal Information under this Agreement. The notification must provide sufficient information to allow affected Data Subjects to take measures against the potential consequences of the compromise, including, if known to Service Provider, the identity of the unauthorised person who may have accessed or acquired the Personal Information;
- (b) Within 3 (three) business days of receipt thereof, of any request for access to or correction of the Personal Information or complaints received by Service Provider

- relating to Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM's obligations in terms of POPIA and provide Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM with full details of such request or complaint; and
- (c) Promptly of any legally binding request for disclosure of Personal Information or any other notice or communication which relates to the Processing of the Personal Information from any supervisory or governmental body.

1.5. Return or destruction of Personal Information

Upon termination of this Agreement or upon request by Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM, Service Provider shall return any material containing, pertaining or relating to the Personal Information disclosed pursuant to this Agreement to Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM. Alternatively, Service Provider shall, at the instance of Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM, destroy such material and shall certify to Kumnkani Mhlontlo LM that it has done so, unless the law prohibits Service Provider from doing so. CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
- 3 Municipal Supply Regulation 38 (1) prescribes that a supply chain management policy must provide measures for the combating of abuse of the supply chain management system, and must enable the accounting officer, among others, to:
